

Checklist for Diplomates ACVIM (Oncology) wanting to apply for ECVIM-CA (Oncology) diplomate status

ACVIM (Oncology) Diplomates, working within Europe may wish to obtain Dipl. ECVIM-CA (Oncology) status in order to practice as European Specialists whilst training Residents

Application should be submitted in electronic form and contain the following items is required

- Covering letter confirming that an average of 24 hours per week is spent working within the discipline
- CV including details on current employment
- Copy of the ACVIM Diploma
- Copy of license to practice veterinary medicine and surgery in the European Community or European Free Trade Association
- Letter from a suitable sponsor confirming satisfactory moral and ethical standing in the profession
- Evidence of significant contribution to companion animal internal medicine, as demonstrated by publications and a high standard of proficiency in the specialty. The minimum requirements for publications are two original companion animal internal medicine papers in refereed scientific journals. For at least one of these papers the applicant must be the principal author and it must be pertinent to medical oncology. Alternatively to the second original paper a review article, case report or case series in international peer reviewed journals are acceptable. In these cases the applicant must be the first author.
- Evidence of 36 weeks of internal medicine training under supervision of a Dipl. ACVIM (Internal Medicine) or ECVIM (Internal Medicine)
- Case log documenting internal medicine cases as outlined in the information brochure
- Documentation of a minimum of 2 oral presentations presented at national or international congresses, one of which has to be a research presentation. . At least one presentation must be within the specialty of Oncology.
