Position Summary

The School of Veterinary Medicine, University College Dublin invites applications for the position of Lecturer/Assistant Professor (locum position) in Small Animal Internal Medicine to commence from June/July 2023.

The UCD Veterinary Hospital has state of the art equipment including CT, MRI, ultrasound, interventional radiology, full endoscopy and arthroscopy, laser, a radioactive iodine unit and fully equipped surgical and intensive care suites. Ancillary supports include rehabilitation and physiotherapy. The Section currently has capacity for 13 Clinical Academics/Specialist Clinicians including four surgery, six internal medicine, two emergency and critical care and one oncology specialists. These staff are supported by 10 interns (rotating and discipline specific), 9 residents and a full team of ancillary staff.

The candidate should be a Diplomate of the American or European College of Veterinary Internal Medicine; however, this position would also suit candidates who are eligible to sit the relevant certifying examinations. UCD has a very strong record in preparing Residents for their ECVIM examinations and the successful candidate will be given ample opportunity to prepare. The candidate must hold a veterinary degree that is registerable with the Veterinary Council of Ireland (VCI).

The successful candidate will work with a team of five Diplomates in Internal Medicine including Professor Carmel T Mooney, Associate Prof Emma O' Neill, Assistant Prof Monica Augusto, Assistant Prof Benoit Cuq and Associate Prof Kevin Murtagh and five Internal Medicine Residents, at various stages of training. The candidate will be further supported by four Diplomates in Diagnostic Imaging (and three Residents), two Diplomates in Surgery (and three Residents), one Diplomate in Oncology and a visiting Diplomate in Cardiology. The successful candidate will work out of the UCD Vet Hospital, located in Belfield, South County Dublin, Ireland.

The core duties will be to enhance the department's reputation through scholarship in clinical activities and teaching by delivering professional services within the hospital, delivering clinical training to veterinary undergraduate students, and participating in the Internal Medicine postgraduate training programmes. We are looking for someone who wants to be part of a team, with a passion for both Internal Medicine and teaching.

Dublin, located on Ireland's east coast on the mouth of the river Liffey, has something to offer everybody. It boasts many historical buildings, fantastic parks, beautiful coastline, ample shopping, a vibrant

restaurant scene and lively nightlife. Dublin airport, only 10km from the city centre, makes travelling into and out of Ireland easy.

UCD is a public research University located in South County Dublin. With over 30,000 students it is Ireland's largest University and amongst the most prestigious in the country. Boasting the only School of Veterinary Medicine on the island of Ireland with few other referral centres, UCD's referral case load is strong and varied. The veterinary hospital sits on an idyllic campus which has many amenities including the famous University Club, where University staff can relax and enjoy the café, the restaurant and the bar! There is a large sports and fitness centre on campus, a 50m swimming pool and a pitch or court for whatever sport you may like.

This position offers a generous renumeration package (depending on experience/diplomat status) and a good work life balance with no weekend or OOH duties.
