A new clinical pathology laboratory is being established, offering applicants the opportunity to develop clinical and research interests in this field. The medicine section is supported by a team of specialists across multiple disciplines including surgery, dermatology, diagnostic imaging, anaesthesia, emergency and critical care and clinical pathology and a busy primary care service. About the Role

Murdoch University and the School of Veterinary Medicine are currently undergoing extensive restructuring, and this represents an exciting opportunity to join a dynamic small animal medicine team. We are looking for an enthusiastic and skilled small animal medicine clinician to join the current team to expand the clinical referral service in small animal medicine, engage in resident training, and teach within the veterinary science programme. The appointee will be expected to provide leadership in clinical work, teaching and research related to small animal medicine. There is flexibility to negotiate duties and responsibilities. The Hospital is keen to develop new clinical services and directions, and the acquisition of additional skills in teaching or research will be strongly supported.

The successful candidate will have a degree in Veterinary Science registrable in Western Australia. A clinical specialist qualification (DipECVIM-CA, DACVIM) or FANZCVS) is required. Applicants must be experienced with clinical work at a specialist level, and be able to work as part of a multidisciplinary team. A high level of written and oral communication skills and experience in teaching at the undergraduate or postgraduate level are also essential. Additional postgraduate qualifications in research or teaching are ideal.
