Intern in Small Animal Oncology



We are seeking an intern to join our vibrant clinical team in the Royal (Dick) Hospital for Small Animals, University of Edinburgh.

The Royal (Dick) School of Veterinary Studies has superb facilities at the Easter Bush Campus, nestled at the foot of the Pentland Hills, within very easy reach of city and country. The Oncology service is based in the Hospital for Small Animals, on this campus. Attached directly to the Hospital, the Riddell-Swan Cancer Centre houses state-of-the-art imaging (CT and MRI) and radiotherapy facilities (Varian Medical Systems VitalBeam linear accelerator) and supports the oncology service. The Head of the Oncology service is Professor Laura Blackwood. Including Laura, there are five senior staff, three of whom hold DipECVIM. One of our senior lecturers is ACVRO (Magda Parys) and we have two Add RadOnc holders. In addition, both the Head of College (David Argyle) and Co-Director of Clinical Services (Sue Murphy) are boarded oncologists who continue to support the service. Oncology has a team of six residents (five in medical oncology and one in radiation oncology) and one intern (this is an additional post), four dedicated nurses, and two therapeutic radiographers. The Hospital has a great team of dedicated staff, keen to provide cross disciplinary support.

This is a fantastic opportunity to join the team and develop your skills in oncology, supporting clinical service provision in both medical and radiation oncology. The internship is the perfect springboard to a residency and a career in oncology.

The University of Edinburgh is one of the world's top universities, consistently ranked in the world top 50*, and placed 16th in the 2022 QS World University Ranking. The School is accredited by the
