

Senior Clinician in Small Animal Internal Medicine

Professional Environment

The Veterinary Teaching Hospital for Companion Animals (Chuv-AC) of the National Veterinary School of Alfort is recruiting a veterinarian for a clinician position in internal medicine, starting in January 2025.

The senior clinician will join the internal medicine department of the Veterinary Teaching Hospital for Companion Animals (Chuv-Ac). Open year-round (12 months, 7 days a week, 24 hours a day), the Chuv-Ac is a large veterinary hospital equipped with a 3,600 m² technical platform that includes a CT scanner, fluoroscopy, digital radiography, MRI, endoscopy equipment, EMG, EEG, laser, and more. The team consists of numerous specialists, residents, junior clinicians, and veterinary nurses as well as support staff.

The internal medicine department manages approximately 3,700 consultations annually (general medicine, internal medicine, oncology, and neurology), 3,220 hospitalization days, and associated investigation tests. The clinican will join a team of faculty members, a contract hospital clinician, as well as 5 hospital assistants and 5 residents.

Job Objectives

The hospital clinician in small animal internal medicine will have the following main responsibilities:

- Consultations and follow-up of hospitalized animals: The clinician will participate in consultations, investigations, and the follow-up of hospitalized patients in the internal medicine department. They will actively contribute to the continuous improvement of care quality and services provided to animals, their owners, and referring veterinarians. The clinician may also develop a specific area of internal medicine based on their expertise and the department's needs.
- Clinical supervision and teaching: The clinician will participate in student training through clinical and theoretical activities in the department. These activities will align with competency frameworks and the accreditation criteria of the European Association of Establishments for Veterinary Education (EAEVE).
- Continuing education and supplementary training: The clinician will participate in the training of interns and residents. They will supervise residents enrolled in the ECVIM residency program and may become a resident advisor. The clinician will contribute to continuing





education for practicing veterinarians, both French and international. They may be involved in organizing continuing education days at EnvA.

- Clinical research: The clinician will be encouraged to develop or participate in clinical research projects in their areas of expertise, contributing to the scientific advancement of the department's clinical activities.
- Management and organization of the internal medicine department: The clinician will be involved in clinical organization. They may be asked to manage the department, depending on the structure defined by the hospital management.

Required Skills

- Licensed veterinarian, eligible to practice in France;
- Diplomate of the European or American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (ECVIM-CA or ACVIM), or having completed a residency and being eligible for the final examination;
- Strong team player with a keen interest in supervision and management;
- Demonstrated teaching skills and a strong interest in education;
- Experience in scientific communication (conferences, publications in peer-reviewed journals) is an asset.
