Will you be our new colleague in internal medicine? Half time on clinics, half time working on a PhD!

The Internal Medicine team of the Small Animal Department, Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, Ghent University, Belgium is looking for an enthusiastic colleague to strengthen their sparkling team.

We can offer you a **full time position** (2 year renewable contract for a 6 year period in total). Diplomates in Internal Medicine (ECVIM-ca or ACVIM), <u>or</u> fully trained residents in Internal Medicine are invited to apply. This can be a perfect position for someone willing to do a PhD but not willing to give up clinics! If you still need to take your specialist exam; time to prepare for the exam will be foreseen.

The Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of Ghent University is ranked among the top Universities and has a modern hospital. We are located approximately 2 hours from the University of Utrecht (Netherlands) and from the University of Liège (Belgium). The hospital is well-equipped (Xray, high tech ultrasound, CT, MRI, scintigraphy, endoscopy, bronchoscopy, cystoscopy,...). The actual internal medicine team includes 6 specialists in internal medicine (Dip ECVIM-ca, one also Dip ACVIM, 2 are part time), 4 residents, 1 ECVIM board-eligible veterinarian and several PhD students. The small animal clinic also has European Diplomates and approved residency programs in surgery, cardiology, neurology, radiology and dermatology. Additionally, this team is strengthened by 10 rotating interns, a full-time veterinarian on hospitalisation and a part-time dentist, behaviourist and ophthalmologist. The caseload for small animals is around 15 000 cases a year. More information about our Faculty can be found on https://www.ugent.be/di/.

The Faculty of Veterinary Medicine is located next to the beautiful town of Ghent, 30 minutes from Bruges, Antwerp and Brussels.
