Assistant/Associate/Full Professor of Small Animal Internal Medicine

The Mississippi State University College of Veterinary Medicine (MSU CVM) has an opening for a clinical or tenure track faculty position in Small Animal Internal Medicine at the Assistant Professor, Associate Professor or Full Professor level. The College is renowned for its clinical education because students in the four-year DVM program spend two full years in clinics. Clinical services, research programs, and community outreach programs match or exceed those of other veterinary colleges. Faculty are well compensated and the MSU CVM values community, family, and work/life balance. Mississippi offers low house prices and an affordable cost of living, and this allows faculty to enjoy a comfortable lifestyle. The MSU CVM is located in Starkville, Mississippi and this is a modern small city that offers culture, college sports, and access to natural areas. Salary and rank are commensurate with qualifications and experience (range \$150,000 to \$200,000). Benefits package includes paid vacation, retirement, health insurance, and consulting options. Applications will be accepted until the position is filled.

Teaching responsibilities involve didactic teaching and clinical training of professional students, interns, residents, and graduate students. Service responsibilities involve clinical case management, rotating emergency duty, and consultation with private practitioners. Clinical duties in the Small Animal Medicine service will be shared with three other faculty members. The service currently has five residents enrolled in an ACVIM-approved three-year combined residency and thesis-driven master's program. For tenure-track faculty members in particular, participation in the college's continuing education and clinical research program is strongly encouraged, as is the development of a specific area of clinical and research focus and expertise. For tenure-track faculty members in particular, external grant acquisition and supervision of postgraduate degree students is encouraged and supported, and initial funding (up to \$50,000 over 5 years) is available to support the development of research initiatives. Diplomate status in the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine is preferred, but specialists with non-ACVIM specialty credentials such as ECVIM-CA, and residency-trained individuals eligible for final certification examination, will also be considered. An advanced degree and experience in clinical research are desirable.
