

Resident in small animal internal medicine, starting August the 31st, 2026

The position

The Ecole Nationale Vétérinaire de Toulouse (ENVT), Department of Small Animal Clinical Sciences, Small Animal Internal Medicine Unit, offers a position for a **3 years training programme** structured according to the guidelines of, and **approved by, the ECVIM-CA**.

The resident will take primary responsibility for small animal Internal Medicine cases. He/she will be scheduled to take part in the primary **emergency duty rotation** of the Veterinary Teaching Hospital. The resident will be involved in clinical teaching to students, and will be partially responsible for advising interns. External rotations are part of the programme.

The Resident will also take part to one or several clinical research studies.

The programme is under supervision of 3 ECVIM Diplomate, 2 National Specialists in Small Animal Internal Medicine, and in strong collaboration with an ACVIM/ACVECC and a ECVECC Diplomate.

Required profile

A European Association of Establishments for Veterinary Education –approved DVM (or equivalent veterinary degree completed with a **valid license to practice veterinary medicine in France**) is mandatory.

Candidates should have **successfully completed a one-year rotating internship programme** (or at least two years of experience in a small animal practice with a dedicated area for internal medicine).

They should have **solid knowledge of the French language**, and be willing to improve these language skills as needed to efficiently communicate with our patients' owners.

The site

The ENVT is an internationally renowned provider of education and research and has staff and students based in Toulouse, a vibrant and developing city in the South West of France. It is located conveniently in-between the Mediterranean Sea, the Atlantic Ocean and the Pyrenean mountains, and provides all the agreements of the “French way of life”. The ENVT was founded in 1825, and its wooded campus, located 15 minutes from Toulouse downtown, is 53 Ha wide and includes many sport facilities.

The ENVT Teaching Hospital is a modern, fully equipped facility that includes digital radiography, ultrasound, 40-slice CT, complete video endoscopy, a complete Laboratory for interventional endoscopy, an echocardiography machine, digital ECG, and digital Holter units. The Department of Small Animal Clinical Sciences includes tenure and clinical-track faculty, including French or European -certified specialists in surgery, internal medicine, emergency and critical care, neurology, ophthalmology, clinical pathology, pathology dermatology, nutrition, reproduction, and has dedicated technical support staff. Caseload for small animals is around 10000 cases a year.
